Sadamisaki Peninsula

Do you know the Sadamisaki Peninsula? It is the westernmost peninsula in Shikoku and is the longest and slenderest peninsula in Japan, sandwiched between Iyonada (Seto Inland Sea) and Uwakai (Pacific Ocean).

It is famous for its oranges, but also for its abundant and fresh seafood. Why don't you come to the rich nature of the Sadamisaki Peninsula and heal your body and soul for a while?

There are many things you can do on the Sadamisaki Peninsula! Rent an e-bike and ride to the westernmost point of the peninsula, or enjoy a drive where you can see the different oceans on each side.

Enjoy the hot spring baths while camping. Enjoy the mountain cherry blossoms in spring, lighthouse cruises, BBQs, and swimming in the sea in summer.

In winter, of course, tangerines and local seafood await you.

Popular Sightseeing Spots and Attractions



SPOT 1

Westernmost tip of Shikoku Sadamisaki Lighthouse



The white lighthouse at the tip of the Sadamisaki Peninsula, the longest and slenderest peninsula in Japan, has been protecting the safety of the sea for more than 100 years since 1918. It is a 1.8-km (20-minute) walk to the lighthouse, but there is a well-maintained promenade. The distance from Kyushu is so close that I was surprised! You can go inside the lighthouse and see the "emerald time" when the light is turned on.

SPOT 2

Sadamisaki Peninsula Museum



The Sadamisaki Peninsula Museum will open in 2023 with a collection of history and folk culture passed down from generation to generation. The museum conveys the characteristics and attractions of the region. Inside the museum, there is an indigo dyeing atelier for indigo grown on the peninsula, a café with a spectacular view, a terrace overlooking the two oceans, a restaurant on the premises, and a store where you can buy local specialties, making it a must-visit spot!



SPOT 3

Kamegaike Onsen Hot spring



Kamegaike Onsen is a natural hot spring that gushes forth from 1,500 meters underground in harmony with beautiful nature. The spring water from the source will soothe you after a hard day's travel. There is also an open-air bath and sauna. In addition to restaurants and stores, there is also an accommodation facility "Kamenoyu Bettei (Villa)" for your full enjoyment!

SPOT 4

Ancient Japanese upcycling! Experience "Sakiori" weaving



The Misaki area has an ancient "Sakiori" culture. Sakiori-weaving is a technique in which old clothes are ripped into threads and woven again. This is what we now call "upcycling". The technique uses a variety of fabrics to create unique colors that are not found in any other weaving technique. If you are not up to the experience, just observing the process is OK! You can easily visit the workshop by renting a bicycle from Misaki Port (Reservations required).
